FROM SETBACK TO SUCCESS: THE TRANSFORMATIVE ROLE OF DIGITAL IMPLANT WORKFLOWS



When implants fail, their wake can be devastating. Early management of hard and soft tissue deficiencies, periodontal breakdown, and prosthetic complications ensures lasting esthetic and functional implant outcomes, with fewer surprises. 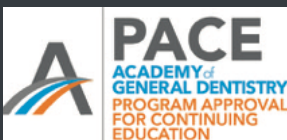
